PRIVACY POLICY

1. Introduction

2. What Personal Information We Collect

- Financial records, bank details, employment and income information
- Information about business operations and financial performance
- Information required for tax returns, BAS, audits, or financial statements

3. How We Collect Personal Information

We collect personal information:

- Directly from you (in person, via email, phone, or through our website)
- From third parties, such as the Australian Taxation Office (ATO), financial institutions, or your employer (with your consent)
- When you complete our forms or provide documents
- Through our website (e.g. contact forms, cookies see Section 9)

4. Why We Collect Personal Information

We collect, hold, use and disclose your personal information to:

- Provide accounting, taxation, business advisory, and related services
- Comply with legal and regulatory obligations (e.g., ATO requirements)
- Communicate with you
- Maintain accurate client records
- · Improve our services

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5. Disclosure of Personal Information

We may disclose your information to:

- Government authorities such as the ATO or ASIC
- Third-party service providers (e.g., cloud hosting providers, software vendors)
- · Financial institutions or your nominated representatives
- Other third parties as required or authorised by law

6. Storage and Security

We take reasonable steps to protect personal information from misuse, interference, loss, and unauthorised access or disclosure. This includes:

- · Secure physical and electronic storage systems
- Password protection, authentication regime, and security software programs.
- Staff training in privacy obligations

8. Retention and Personal Information
